

Outdoor Activities – Hiking Trails

THE DRAGON'S BACK

Dragon's Back was voted the "Best Urban Hiking Trail" in Asia by Time (Asia edition) in 2004. The Dragon's Back is a path connecting Wan Cham Shan and Shek O Peak, stretching vertically over D'Aguilar Peninsula. The path undulates between these hill tops, reminiscent of the shape of a dragon's backbone. Just a short hop from the bustle of Hong Kong East, it provides stunning views of Shek O, Tai Long Wan, Stanley, Tai Tam and the South China Sea.

SHING MUN RESERVOIR HIKE

To explore the flora and fauna of Hong Kong, the Shing Mun Reservoir Hike in Tsuen Wan is a walking trail not-to-be-missed. Completed in 1937, Shing Mun Reservoir is a great source of fresh water and home to many species of butterflies, migratory birds and monkeys. The village of Tai Wai in front of the reservoir is now gone, but its protective feng shui woods remain, which boast more than 70 species of trees.
