### The Louvre Museum

The world's most-visited museum, and a historic landmark in Paris, France. It is the home of some of the best-known works of art, including the Mona Lisa and the Venus de Milo.

Louis XIII's old hunting pavilion was transformed and extended by his son, Louis XIV, when he installed the Court and government there in 1682. A succession of kings continued to embellish the Palace up until the French Revolution.

### Grand Véfour

A jewel of 18th century decorative art, in a setting - The gardens of the Palais-Royal - Le Grand Véfour has been the gastronomic hotspot of political, artistic and literary life in Paris for more than 200 years. A charming privatized, restored and air-conditioned lounge is available on the 1st floor for meals for 8 to 16 people.

### Darocco

Italy in Paris is heading west! Daroco 16, the fruit of the trio of Parisian restaurant savvy, Alexandre Giesbert, Julien Ross and Romain Glize, is stirring up the 16th arrondissement with its vibrant and festive neo-trattoria atmosphere. Neighboring the Maison de la Radio, facing Beaugrenelle, with its stylish terrace overlooking the Seine, its dazzling Bleu Klein façade and its large eighties neon sign, Daroco 16 catches the eye with its exceptional location and dimensions.

## Bouillon Chartier

The Bouillon Chartier, listed as a historical monument. At the end of the 19th century, Paris was transformed, the golden age of industrial civilization was dawning, the capital needed workers. To feed the masons, the carpenters, the navvies who are hungry, Frédéric and Camille Chartier serve their customers a bowl of broth and pot au feu. The restaurant is huge, open 7 days a week at all hours, the success is immediate.













#### BARS

## Harry's New York Bar

The bar, which opened in 1911, is famous for many reasons — like being the former watering hole of expat writers like F. Scott Fitzgerald and Ernest Hemingway. But the bar is also the birthplace of the world's favorite hangover cure.

## Danico

The band of mixologists in marinière (a tribute to Gaultier obliges), well led by Nico de Soto (ex-Experimental Club passed by Mace in New York), pushes the cursor of originality to the limit. They have imagined a menu of frankly delirious cocktails, based on matcha, marshmallow or even bacon which is bound to leave you perplexed.

## Experimental Cocktail Club

The Experimental Cocktail Club is the bar that launched an empire. Paris' first speakeasy-style cocktail bar was such a runaway hit that it proved to be the first step in a new hospitality powerhouse.

## The Labo Bar Club: LGBTQ+

Perfect for Late-night cocktails, DJs & karaoke parties at a buzzing bar/club with a lively street terrace. Located in the historically the central iron-clad market of Paris, Les Halles, that has evolved architecturally since then but the pulsating energy has stayed the same.













### **CLUBS**

## Matignon

An emblematic place of the Golden Triangle, the Matignon brings soft light to its spaces, infusing a sensual modernity and an insolent refinement distinctive of Jacques Garcia. Coats of mail, mirrors and wood panelling adorn the walls for glamorous dinners of modern gastronomy, or chic cocktails enjoyed at the bar. The place that gradually became a success then lead to the club designed by Charles Tassin. A place of celebration par excellence, the playground with its deep house and the safari-club decor of yesteryear is one of the festive temples of the capital. With its resident DJs and events evenings, the Matignon is an institution of Parisian nightlife.



## Jangal

Jangal (Sanskrit JANGALA) is a veritable plant alcove surrounded by Maharaja portraits. Where the Paris Paris had its best years, the Jangal has released its claws and imposed its chic jungle style in the first numbers of the avenue de l'Opéra. An address that connects all of Paris, a stone's throw from the left bank, East and West come together in a place for true music lovers.



#### Le Sinner

Revealing spectacular spaces and views of the restaurant, the Sinner Bar is a representation of an avant-garde, creative, joyful and buzzing neighbourhood. It combines an open space with an enticing and opulent atmosphere and an exclusive and more intimate room behind curtains.
