

Explore Bangkok - A Must See



Wat Phra Kaew & Grand Palace

The Temple of the Emerald Buddha is purpose-built to house a figurine of the meditating Buddha seated in a yogic posture. Carved from a single solid piece of green jade and adorned with gold and diamonds, the statue is placed high above the heads of worshippers and tourists as a sign of respect.

The Grand Palace in Bangkok spans a 218,400-square-meter man-made island comprising numerous buildings, halls, pavilions, and temples arranged around lawns, gardens, and courtyards. It is located in the heart of the city, along the banks of Bangkok's major river, the Chao Phraya.

Getting there: By car - Na Phralan Road / By boat – Maharaj Pier

Open daily 08:30 AM - 3:30 PM

Admission fee: 500 Baht

Dress code: shorts and sleeveless shirts are not allowed. Please present your passport at the security check point before the entrance.



Wat Arun

Wat Arun assertively stands in awe of Bangkok's skyline well established prior to industrialisation. Visitors journey here in pilgrim like status, due to it's one of few temples you are permitted to climb its main staircase, rewarding the intrepid with panoramic views of the bustling Chao Phraya river, the Grand Palace and Wat Pho on the opposite bank.

Getting there: By boat – Wat Arun Pier

Open daily 08:00 AM - 6:00 PM

Admission fee: 200 Baht

Dress code: shorts and sleeveless shirts are not allowed. Please present your passport at the security check point before the entrance.



Asiatique

Asiatique the Riverfront The East Asiatic pier has been restored to its original glory under the name “ASIATIQUE -The Riverfront”. The first and the biggest lifestyle project in Asia on the banks of the Chao Phraya River features shopping, dining, a riverside promenade and Ferris wheel.

Getting there: Take BTS Ratchadamri to Sapan Taksin station and connect to Asiatique the Riverfront ferry from Taksin pier

Opening hours: Daily 11:00 AM – 12:00 AM

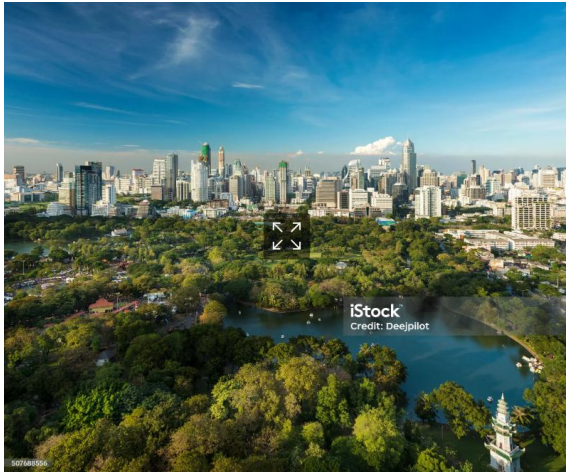


Jim Thompson House

Hidden in the Pathumwan district—Bangkok’s hub of business, education, and fashion—is a small yet captivating museum: the Jim Thompson House. This traditional Thai teakwood residence once belonged to the American entrepreneur who played a pivotal role in reviving Thai silk. Jim Thompson was not only an art collector but also a cultural figure who profoundly influenced Thailand and Southeast Asia. **Getting there:** by car, taxi, tuk tuk, and the BTS Sky Train (National Stadium station exit no.1)

Admission fee: 250 Baht

Opening hours: Daily 10:00 AM – 05:00 PM



Lumpini Park

Lumpini Park is Bangkok's first public park and a major green space for recreation and community events. Visitors can relax, exercise, practice martial arts, dance, read, or enjoy water activities like paddle boating and kayaking at the central pond. The park also hosts festivals and ceremonies, offers free classes at the *Centre for Healthy Aging*, and features inclusive areas such as the *Smiling Sun Area* for people with disabilities. It also serves as a hub for senior citizens through the *Ploenchit Senior Citizens Association of Bangkok*.

Getting there: by car, taxi, tuk tuk, the BTS Sky Train (Sala Dang Station), and MRT (Silom Station)

Opening hours: Daily 04.30 AM - 10.00 PM

DJ Station

One of Bangkok's most popular clubs, known for lively crowds, drag cabaret shows, and up-to-date music. With a cover charge that includes drinks and nightly performances, it's a favorite weekend spot for locals and visitors alike. Be prepared for big crowds and an early closing time at 2 a.m., but the vibrant atmosphere makes it a must-visit nightlife destination



The Stranger Bar

Thailand's first drag venue, founded in 2012, now a vibrant nightlife hub on Silom Soi 4. Known for interactive drag shows, bold cocktails, and a welcoming atmosphere, it's a must-visit spot to experience Bangkok's drag culture. Shows start around 10 p.m., with an entry fee (about THB 500) that includes two drinks.



Beef

BEEF. brings the vibrant energy of Bangkok's gay nightlife to the 9th floor of SilomEdge, creating a welcoming haven primarily for the Bear community while warmly embracing guests from all walks of life. As one of the city's most inclusive venues, this dynamic nightclub pulses with DJ-curated beats and hosts regular themed parties alongside sultry gogo performances
