Botanic Gardens

Escape the bustling city for a few hours and make your way to Botanic Gardens. Spread across 28 acres, the gardens boast an impressive array of floral displays and charming walking paths. Head into The Palm House, one of the earliest examples of a glasshouse made from curved iron and glass, and you'll instantly be transported into a tropical oasis. Botanic Gardens promises a peaceful retreat in the heart of Belfast.



Union Street Bar

You can pop in for a quiet drink and good food during the day, yet Union Street is well known as a lively venue at night. Sunday nights are famous for the 'Sunday Bingo Show' – popular with hens and groups of friends. The rooftop cocktail bar here is fabulous with great food, atmosphere and a wide range of cocktails.



St George's Market

If it's fresh food, artisanal crafts and delicious street food that you're after, then St George's Market is a place that you'll not want to miss. This historic market dates back to the 1890s, expect to find live music, talented buskers and a lively ambience.




Common Market
