A TRAVEL GUIDE TO BERMUDA

Bermuda has a growing and vibrant LGBTQ+ presence, led by groups like *OUT Bermuda*, which organizes advocacy, social events, and the island's annual *Pride* celebrations.

While the island is still somewhat conservative, Bermuda does have legal protections against discrimination based on sexual orientation (Human Rights Act 1981), and most visitors find the community warm and welcoming especially in Hamilton and other popular gathering spots.



Bars

While Bermuda doesn't have dedicated gay bars, there are plenty of welcoming restaurants and lounges where everyone can feel comfortable. Hamilton's dining scene is lively and inclusive, with great cocktails and casual nightlife at spots like Devil's Isle, Pickled Onion, Port O' Call, and the Terrace, along with smaller wine bars and beachside cafés across the island. Many local establishments embrace a friendly, open-minded atmosphere, especially during Pride Week when the island feels especially festive.

Pride

The Bermuda Pride Parade takes place each summer, usually in early July, with events spanning an entire week. Festivities center around Victoria Park in Hamilton, featuring live music, food vendors, and a colourful parade through the city's streets. The event is free and open to everyone, blending celebration with activism under themes like "Pride is Protest. Pride is Power. Pride is Us." Throughout the week, OUTBermuda also hosts drag brunches, panel talks, and community gatherings.
